








Hallberg-Rassy 372 fastest in category in second part of Tjörn Runt

A Hallberg-Rassy 372 with in-mast furling was the fastest boat in category on actual time in the second part of the world's largest inshore race, Tjörn Runt. The actual sailed time from Kårevik, south Tjörn, to the finish line, was only 1 hour 33 minutes and 52 seconds, two minutes and one second faster than the second fastest boat in the category.

The Hallberg-Rassy 372 is the heaviest boat in the category but still the fastest in this part of the race. In

total, the boat did not win the category, however.

The category consisted of many light and racing oriented boats like First 36.7, First 35 (latest model, Farr design), X-34, Dynamic 35, First 34.7, Gambler 38, Melges 24, Bavaria Match 35 and more.

The furling mainsail is an Elvström Epex FatFurl.
The course on the second leg was downwind, around 12 knots of true wind.

Another victory for a Hallberg-Rassy 412

It seems to have become a habit: a cruising equipped Hallberg-Rassy 412 with in-mast furling won in a big race. The race is called Schifffahrts-regatta, organised by Peter Gast Shipping and has totally 132 participating boats and is the largest privately organized offshore race in the world.

The 30 nautical miles regatta started outside Schleimünde in Germany and ended in Ærøskøbing in Denmark.

It was a thrilling race and the Hallberg-Rassy 412 was in a top position already at the first upwind course. After a gybe manoeuver that didn't work well at all, and a screwed up gennaker, it took some time to come up in a top position again.

After half the race, it was only a 45 footer ahead in the category. For the final 15 nautical miles, the boats were so close that the crews could yell to each other. The last five nautical miles, the distance between the boats got less and less. At the finish line, the difference was just 23 seconds, enough for the 412 to win the category on calculated time, and the 45 footer on the second place.

The 412 won her category and placed third overall out of 73 yachts with this handicap system. This is an even better result than last years category victory for this 412, although the handicap value was adjusted so that the same 412 had to sail almost two per cent faster to achieve the same result.





Record number of boats in The Hallberg-Rassy Rally where everybody wins 2015

The 2015 edition of The Hallberg-Rassy Rally where everybody wins has been a record when it comes to participating boats. 30 boats and 71 sailors from seven countries joined the rally. The boats were from the 1970s, 80s, 90s 00s and the newest just a week old. Everybody had a real good time. Two dinners were included in the start fee. On Friday it was grilled filet of veal with ovenbaked potatoes and redwinesauce. On Saturday mixed grill, loin of pork, chicken and chorizo, barbecue sauce, tzatziki, roasted potatoes, mixed salad, homebaked bread and butter. The wea-

ther was nice too with 8-10 knots from SW, warm and sunshine. As the tradition says with this popular Rally, there was no time keeping and only winners. Every boat won some kind of category. Prizes were generous, including for example a folding bicycle, a chart plotter, an inverter, a portable fridge, a sprayhood, life vests, led lights, tool kits, sailing clothes, a radio controlled car, and a lot more.





The new Hallberg-Rassy 40 Mk II: We

The new Hallberg-Rassy 40 Mark II will be finished in September 2015. She follows the success of the 43 Mk III, 48 Mk II, 55 and 64 with more natural light, more elegance and further improved interior comfort. An already good boat got even better.

The two first boats will be in production at the Open Yard weekend 21-23 August 2015.

19 improvements

There are 19 improvements compared to the previous 40:

Exterior:


- 25 cm taller rig with somewhat more sail area
- Gennaker or spinnaker now hoisted from mast head, not from top of headstay
- New saloon portlights; larger, frameless, like on the 43 Mk III, 48 Mk II, 55 and 64, give more natural light
- Two hull portlights in the saloon
- New low profile ventilators with built in ping

pong balls

- More elegant design of the windshield with rounded top on the side panels, similar to the 412, 43 Mk III, 48 Mk II, 55 and 64
- More elegant design of the pushpit and pulpit, similar to the larger models
- Bow- and stern thrusters, with docking function, available as an option
- Possibility to get the genoa sheet winches as Revo, which means also reversible function
- Deeper cockpit floor under the grating for improved drainage capacity without compromising the easy access to the cabin
- Improved headroom below the boom; 10 cm

Interior improvements:

- Improved entrance stair; less steep and more comfortable steps
- Two hull portlights in the saloon give eye-contact to the world outside while seated in the saloon

- Saloon alcoves with white painted wooden panels and hull portlights like the larger models
- Possibility for good size retractable 32 inch TV starboard in the saloon
- New layout option for the aft cabin: sofa to starboard, superwide, superlong berth to port; 2.37 m long, 1.79 m wide at the forward end, 1.18 m wide at the foot end.
- Opening portlights between the galley and the cockpit, and between the nav station and the cockpit
- Optional charcoal filter extractor in the galley
- Improved access to the v cabin
- Improved and widened sole between the v berths without compromising the good size and comfort of the v berths


Great comfort for long distance cruising

The Hallberg-Rassy 40 Mk II offers great comfort for long distance sailing. She may be ordered with comfort equipment such as stern thruster, back winding genoa sheet winches, washing machine, generator or watermaker. The layout offers much storage and

provides excellent comfort. By using the space in the cockpit coaming, she even offers headroom in the walk through to the aft cabin. There is a separate shower with plexi glass doors in the heads compartment. This interior allows for some special solutions like the famous Hallberg-Rassy Armchairs in the saloon. In 1984, Hallberg-Rassy was the first boatyard in the world to introduce this feature. The saloon is also available with traditional settees.

Easy access, easy maintenance, good sound insulation

Technical equipment is installed in the huge engine room. There you find gear such as main engine, gen set, pumps, filters, charger, inverter, a spare propeller and a lot more. This allows for easy access, easy maintenance and good sound insulation. Main inspection doors are to the starboard side, and there is also additional access from the front and from the floor in the cockpit locker. The floor in the cockpit is bolted in place, so the engine may be lifted out the same way it came in. Hallberg-Rassy boats are sailed actively and intensively for a very long time. Sooner or later parts need to be replaced such as engine or tanks. Then it is good to know that those parts may be taken out the same way they got in; through natural openings of the boat. That is what you need on a Blue Water Cruiser.

bluewater cruising in a Hallberg-Rassy 43

In the summer of 2012, no less than seven family yachts left Sweden to go blue-water cruising. One of them was Per-Olof and Kristina and their 9 and 7 year old daughters. Together, as the only crew, they sailed Meribelle, a Hallberg-Rassy 43 from 2002. In what became a fantastic adventure, the family crossed the North Atlantic and spent a wonderful season in the Lesser Antilles, Caribbean. A journey with stops in Denmark, Scotland, Ireland, Spain, Portugal, Canary Islands, St. Vincent & the Grenadines, Grenada, St. Lucia, Martinique, Dominica, Saint Annes, Antigua and Barbuda, and not least the Azores.

Only five years before leaving, they had bought their first sailing yacht; a Hallberg-Rassy 31. As a novice cruising family, they spent their summer vacations cruising the Baltic coasts around south Sweden, Germany and Denmark, like so many other Scandinavians and Germans do. Gradually the summer sailing was extended from 3 weeks to 5 and the idea of extending the vacation into a cruising adventure in tropical waters and anchoring off the white beaches caught on. Soon the idea had reached the point, where it was clear that they had a real possibility to go.

Not to leave on this journey would be turning down the opportunity of our lives, says Per-Olof. At the same time we had lots of doubts and fears. Would we really like sailing the high seas? Would we really dare to cross oceans?

Having completed their journey, there is no question in their minds: It was truly fantastic! And as for daring to cross oceans, they completed seven crossings of four or more days at sea.
